This is a general election position through November 15, 2020 and reports to the Coalition Director.

Responsibilities Include:

- Help develop and implement a comprehensive coalitions plan reaching targeted communities.
- Build an engagement and outreach strategy with clear goals, timelines, and metrics.
- Outline priorities and objectives for different core constituencies.
- Build and manage a team of staff or volunteers and execute community specific goals and plans.
- Support and provide strategic recommendations for surrogate events and media in lowa.
- Prepare, develop and manage memos and briefings for events, where appropriate, for high-level surrogates, principle travel, and HQ teams.

Requirements:

- Candidates must have strong experience in managing a team.
- The ideal candidate will have held a senior role within a national or state campaign in a previous cycle.
- The ideal candidate will have experience in building a team across different geographies.
- Candidates should have experience developing and implementing effective political and coalitions plans.
- Effective, versatile and action-oriented.
- Excellent communication skills and detail oriented.
